IT'S COLD & FLU SEASON AGAIN!

It's not always easy to tell the difference between a cold and the flu, but here are some general symptoms that may help differentiate between them:

Flu Symptoms	Cold Symptoms
Sudden Onset	Slow Onset
High Fever	No (or mild) Fever
Severe Exhaustion	Mild Exhaustion
Dry Cough	Severe or Hacking Cough
Headache	Usually no headache
Decreased Appetite	Normal Appetite
Muscle Aches	Usually no muscle aches
• Chills	Usually no chills
Usually no sore throat	Sore Throat

Important note: Symptoms vary from child to child; call your child's healthcare provider if you suspect the flu.



Dear Parents,

Daily attendance in classes is important to the success of your child and of East Cliff Elementary. Numerous studies show a strong link between academic performance and consistent attendance. I would like to take this opportunity to share some information with you regarding Texas' new school accountability system that the 84th Legislature passed so that every campus and district receives one of five ratings from A–F. Think of accountability as the grades or numbers on a report card that your child brings home at the end of our nine week grading period. Like your child is evaluated, so too is our school and district. A school's reputation is strongly connected to the accountability rating it receives, and that, in turn, depends on the performance of its students. The Texas Education Agency evaluates public schools and districts under state accountability requirements including attendance rates.

The law requires schools and districts to be issued grades based on five different areas of performance or "domains," and those five grades must be combined into a single overall rating. The domain I would like to focus on is Domain IV.

Current Work-In-Progress Model: Overall Grade Calculation



Domain IV, which is 35% of a campus's overall grade, relies on indicators other than STAAR. At the elementary level this will involve the use of <u>chronic absenteeism</u>. East Cliff Elementary attendance rate was <u>96.5%</u> for the 2015-2016 school year. It was below the state minimum requirement of 97%. Our school's campus student attendance rate goal for this year is meet/exceed <u>98%</u>. East Cliff's current fall semester attendance rate is <u>96.68%</u>. If East Cliff Elementary fails to meet the standard in Domain IV, the campus may be issued a letter grade of an "F" for postsecondary readiness.

Elementary schools lay the foundation for life-long learning and good attendance helps our children do well in middle school, high school, college and at work. We need your assistance in maintaining your child's attendance at an acceptable rate which inevitably effects East Cliff's overall school attendance rate. We appreciate your efforts to avoid unnecessary absences for your child and encourage you to assist us in nurturing a habit of regular attendance for our students. At East Cliff Elementary, we want every child, in every seat, every day and on time.
